HOUSE BILL HB1283

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to crimes and punishments;  
prohibiting sale of high caffeine content pills to  
certain persons; establishing penalty; defining term;  
providing for codification; and providing an  
effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1248 of Title 21, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Any person who sells or furnishes in any manner a high caffeine  
content pill to another person who is under eighteen (18) years of  
age, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be  
punishable by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed six (6)  
months or by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or  
by both such fine and imprisonment. For purposes of this section  
"high caffeine content pill" means any pill or tablet which contains  
more than fifty percent (50%) caffeine as an ingredient.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2001.
