HOUSE BILL HB2016

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to crimes and punishments;
prohibiting publication or dissemination of name or
identity of rape victim; setting penalty; providing
for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1116.1 of Title 21, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person to print, publish,
broadcast, televise, or disseminate through the news media or any
other medium of public dissemination or cause to be printed,
published, broadcast, televised, or disseminated through the news
media or any other medium of public dissemination the name or
identity of any person who may have been raped or upon whom an
assault with intent to commit the offense of rape may have been
made. Any person who violates this section shall, upon conviction,
be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county
jail for not more than one (1) year or by a fine of not more than
One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or by both such fine and
imprisonment.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2002.
