HOUSE BILL HB2055

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Sex Offender Registration Act; requiring registration of all persons previously convicted of sexual child abuse or lewd acts or proposals to a child; allowing retroactive application; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 582.1 of Title 57, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The provisions of the Sex Offender Registration Act shall apply to any person residing, working, or attending school within this state who has ever been convicted, whether upon a verdict or plea of guilty or upon a plea of nolo contendere, or received a suspended sentence or any probationary term for a crime or an attempt to commit a crime provided for in Section 7115 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes if the offense involved sexual abuse or sexual exploitation as those terms are defined in Section 7102 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes or a crime provided for in subsection A of Section 1123 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. The provisions of the Sex Offender Registration Act shall apply to any person who resides, works, or attends school within this state and who has ever been convicted or received a suspended sentence in any court of another state, a federal court, an Indian tribal court, or a military court for a crime or attempted crime provided for in the laws listed in subsection A of this section.

C. This section shall have retroactive application to convictions entered prior to the effective date of this act.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2002.
