HOUSE BILL HB2118

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to motor vehicles; providing registration fee for travel trailers; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1132.5 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

For all travel trailers, a registration fee shall be assessed at the time of initial registration by the owner and annually thereafter, for the use of the avenues of public access within this state. The amount of the fee shall be equal to one and three-quarters percent (1 3/4%) of the factory delivered price. For this purpose the factory delivered price shall be rounded to the nearest One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). The maximum fee levied pursuant to this section shall not exceed Eighty-five Dollars (\$85.00).

After the first year's registration in this or any other state, the fee shall be assessed at ninety percent (90%) of the fee computed and assessed for the first year. Thereafter such fee shall be computed and assessed at ninety percent (90%) of the previous year's fee until a fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) is reached at which time the fee shall remain at Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) annually.

The registration fee provided for in this section shall be in lieu of all other taxes, general or local, unless otherwise specifically provided.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
