AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Board of Medicolegal Investigations; stating certain budget categories; providing duties and compensation of employees; limiting the salary of the Chief Medical Examiner; providing budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees; specifying duties for certain full-time-equivalent employees; making their employment contingent on certain funding; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the Board of Medicolegal Investigations shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of the Board of Medicolegal Investigations by law shall be set by the Chief Medical Examiner. The salary of the Chief Medical Examiner shall not exceed \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003. The Board of Medicolegal Investigations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures

excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. Of the total number of full-time-equivalent employees authorized in this act, two (2.0) shall be employed only with grant funds and dismissed when grant funds are no longer available.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
