AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Department of Public Safety; stating certain budget categories; providing duties and compensation of employees; limiting the salary of the Director; providing budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees; providing exceptions to the budgetary limitations; authorizing certain expenditures; limiting expenditures for certain purpose; providing certain cadet limitation; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the Department of Public Safety shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed

upon the Department of Public Safety by law shall be set by the Director. The Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except the full-time-equivalent employee limit shall not include cadets while they are members of a patrol school or during their employment in probationary status nor shall it include temporary Lake Patrol Officers employed pursuant to Section 840-5.5 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. Of the monies appropriated to the Department of Public Safety not more than Sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000.00) shall be used for the annual lease payment of the Clinton/Sherman Industrial Complex.

SECTION 4. The Department of Public Safety is hereby authorized to expend Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000.00) from the Department of Public Safety Patrol Vehicle Revolving Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, for the purchase of patrol vehicles and equipment necessary to equip those vehicles.

SECTION 5. Of the monies available to the Department of Public Safety, not more than One Hundred Seventy-one Thousand Three Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$171,311.00) may be used to support the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003.

SECTION 6. The Department of Public Safety, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, may have a Patrol Academy consisting of no fewer than thirty (30) cadets.

SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
