AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; requiring certain performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting salary of the Administrator; providing budgetary limitations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

OKLAHOMA HEALTH CARE AUTHORITY

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Health Care Authority by law shall be set by the Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority. The salary of the Administrator shall not exceed ____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
