AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Department of Public Safety;
requiring budgeting in certain categories and
amounts; requiring certain performance measures;
providing for the duties and compensation of
employees; providing budgetary limitations; providing
an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the
Department of Public Safety shall budget all funds in the following
categories and amounts:

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for
each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Department of Public Safety by law shall be set by the Commissioner. The Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except the full-time-equivalent employee limit shall not include cadets while they are members of a patrol school or during their employment in probationary status nor shall it include temporary Lake Patrol Officers employed pursuant to Section 840-5.5 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
