SENATE BILL 1121

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to science and technology entities; requiring the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology to budget in certain categories and amounts; requiring performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting salary of Executive Director; providing budgetary limitations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

OKLAHOMA CENTER FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology by law shall be set by the Oklahoma Center for the

Advancement of Science and Technology. The salary of the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology shall not exceed Eighty-five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003. The Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
