AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Office of Juvenile Affairs; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; requiring performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting the salary of the Director and the number of full-time-equivalent employees; authorizing certain attorney position; providing budgetary limitation on lease-purchase agreements; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

OFFICE OF JUVENILE AFFAIRS

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the Office of Juvenile Affairs shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Office of Juvenile Affairs by law shall be set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003. The Office of Juvenile Affairs is hereby authorized one (1) full-time-equivalent (FTE) position for an attorney. This shall be in addition to the position of General Counsel. The Office of Juvenile Affairs for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2002.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
