AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; requiring certain performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting the salary of the Executive Director; providing budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

OKLAHOMA TOURISM AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department by law shall be set by the Executive Director. The salary of the Executive Director shall not exceed _____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002. The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2001.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
