AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the State Board of Career and Technology Education; providing for the budgeting of funds in certain categories and amounts; requiring performance measures for budget categories; providing for the duties and compensation of employees of the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education; limiting the salary of the Director; providing budgetary limitations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, the State Board of Career and Technology Education shall budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

The State Board shall develop outcome-based performance measures for each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education by

law shall be set by the Board. The salary of the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education shall not exceed ____ Dollars (\$0.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002. The Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2002, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2001.

SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
