SENATE BILL 542

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to counties and county officers; amending 19 O.S. 1991, Section 220, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 310, O.S.L. 1998 (19 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 220); which relates to the Court Clerk's Revolving Fund; clarifying language; providing for report of certain monies; authorizing specified percentage of certain fees be retained; describing purpose for which certain fees may be expended; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 1991, Section 220, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 310, O.S.L. 1998 (19 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 220), is amended to read as follows:

Section 220. A. Beginning July 1, 1991, there is hereby created with the county treasurer of each county within this state a revolving fund to be designated the "Court Clerk's Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received as grants from the federal government and any other monies designated by law for deposit into the fund. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the court clerk ~~in the manner and for the purposes set forth for the court fund as specified in Title 20 of the Oklahoma Statutes to perform the duties imposed upon the court clerk by law.~~ The monies shall be reported quarterly to the Administrator of the Courts on a form prescribed by the State Auditor and Inspector.

B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, ten percent (10%) or a greater percentage if authorized by law, of any fees,

collected for agencies other than the court and not deposited into the fund, shall be retained in the fund to defray administrative costs for collections and disbursements.

~~B.~~ C. There shall be no monies, other than federal funds, deposited into the fund created herein, unless expressly authorized by the Legislature.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2001.
