SENATE BILL 744

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to chiropractic; amending 59 O.S. 1991, Section 161.14, as amended by Section 7, Chapter 390, O.S.L. 1994 (59 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 161.14), which relates to practice without required license; and eliminating gender discrimination.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 1991, Section 161.14, as amended by Section 7, Chapter 390, O.S.L. 1994 (59 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 161.14), is amended to read as follows:

Section 161.14 Any person who shall practice or attempt to practice chiropractic in this state, or who shall hold himself or herself out to the public as a practitioner of chiropractic in this state, without having first obtained an original license to practice chiropractic from the Board of Chiropractic Examiners, or after his or her original license to practice chiropractic has been revoked, or while such original license is under suspension, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punishable by a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than five (5) days nor more than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each day of such violation shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.
