This is to advise you that on this date, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution to approve or object to legislation presented to me, I have VETOED House Bill **1237** because this bill would have the effect of diminishing the quality of the water and air of Oklahoma. Requiring facilities to be “predominately” used for camping or recreational purposes in order to benefit from the three mile set back requirement is not in tune with affording Oklahomans an opportunity to

enjoy our rich, valuable natural resources. In addition, the Oklahoma Water Board's current process of reviewing water permit applications adequately addresses the issues raised in this bill.

By doing so, this leaves open the possibility of the State being held liable where there has been no showing of State culpability.
