The Department shall establish a date by which the reports shall be filed. The Department shall evaluate the reports submitted by the school districts and compile the results into an annual state report on math/science substitution. The state report shall be filed with the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

5. The State Board of Education shall establish criteria for evaluating the utilization of the math/science substitution by school districts. If the Board determines that a school district is over utilizing the math/science substitution it shall have the authority to prohibit the school district from allowing any further math/science substitution for students, provided, students previously granted a math/science substitution shall be allowed to continue and complete that option."
