"SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 36 O. S. L. 2000, as amended by Section 23, Chapter 418, O.S.L. 2000 (53 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 4.13) is hereby amended to read as follows:

A. ~~A park located on a parcel of land presently owned by The University Center of Tulsa Trust Authority within the area of the City of Tulsa, Oklahoma, known as "Greenwood", all appurtenances and all personal property attached thereto, shall be transferred from The University Center of Tulsa Trust Authority to the Oklahoma Historical Society. The Oklahoma Historical Society shall have the same powers and duties with respect to the transferred land as were previously vested in The University Center of Tulsa Trust Authority.~~ The Oklahoma Historical Society is hereby authorized to acquire real property for the site for the location of The 1921 Tulsa Race Riot Memorial of Reconciliation. The site selection shall involve the cooperation of The 1921 Tulsa Race Riot Memorial of Reconciliation Committee. The Society shall assume the performance of all existing and future obligations related to the development, design, operation and maintenance of The 1921 Tulsa Race Riot Memorial of Reconciliation created in Section 8201.1 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. The Society shall hold and use the land transferred to the Oklahoma Historical Society pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of this section for the development, design and construction of The 1921 Tulsa Race Riot Memorial of Reconciliation commemorating the lives of the victims and honoring the survivors of The 1921 Tulsa Race Riot. The Society shall erect the memorial pursuant to procedures outlined in Section 8201.1 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

C. The Oklahoma Historical Society shall take all actions necessary to identify and exhume the remains of victims of "The 1921 Tulsa Race Riot."
