MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of the following engrossed measures.

The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 31 – Price of the Senate and Bonny of the House.

An Act relating to the Legislature; amending 74 O.S. 1991, Sections 452.7 and 452.8, which relate to the Joint Committee on Federal Funds; correcting language; deleting requirement to meet monthly; eliminating certain powers and duties of the Committee; deleting mandatory language and providing permissive language; changing reference to federal monies; deleting certain filing deadline; providing clarification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 79 – Morgan of the Senate and Ericson of the House.

[probate - financial institutions - property of decedent - effective date]

SB 83 – Price of the Senate and Benge of the House.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 1991, Section 954A, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 215, O.S.L. 1999 (47 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 954A), which relates to the removal of abandoned motor vehicles; requiring the wrecker service to file a Tow Request and Authorization Form with the sheriff's office when it has towed a vehicle from real property located outside of an incorporated municipality; modifying time periods for requesting certain information; responding to requests; providing certain notice; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 124 – Herbert of the Senate and Corn of the House.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 1991, Sections 1136, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 233, O.S.L. 2000 and 1151, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 168, O.S.L. 2000 (47 O.S. Supp. 2000, Sections 1136 and 1151), which relate to the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act; creating Oklahoma State Parks Supporter License Plate; providing for design and issuance thereof; specifying fee, apportionment, and use thereof; allowing certain employees to operate golf carts on streets and highways under certain conditions; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 126 – Price of the Senate and Pope (Clay) of the House.

An Act relating to public health and safety; requiring State Department of Health to apply for specified assistance allowing for enhanced reimbursement for certain services; allowing establishment of specified reimbursement system; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 132 – Monson of the Senate and Cox of the House.

An Act relating to insurance; amending Section 1, Chapter 27, O.S.L. 1994, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 323, O.S.L. 1998 (36 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 6058A), which relates to health benefits; exempting certain coverage from requirements for insurers; and providing an effective date.

SB 145 – Cain of the Senate and Blackburn of the House.

[utilities – resale of water or sewage service – effective date]

SB 149 – Wilcoxson of the Senate and Ferguson of the House.

An Act relating to higher education; creating the Task Force on State Scholarship and Student Aid Grant Programs; providing for appointments, officers, duties, compensation, reimbursement, and staff support for certain task force; requiring certain report; providing for noncodification; and declaring an emergency.

An Act relating to environment and natural resources; amending Section 10, Chapter 215, O.S.L. 1992, as renumbered by Section 359, Chapter 145, O.S.L. 1993 and as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 131, O.S.L. 1999 (27A O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 2-5-110), which relates to the Department of Environmental Quality; providing for certain enforcement hearings to be conducted by an Administrative Law Judge for the Department; and declaring an emergency.

SB 336 – Easley of the Senate and Leist of the House.

An Act relating to environment and natural resources; amending Section 7, Chapter 398, O.S.L. 1992, as renumbered by Section 359, Chapter 145, O.S.L. 1993, and as last amended by Section 55, Chapter 324, O.S.L. 1993 (27A O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 2-2-101) which relates to the Environmental Quality Board; removing certain term limits for Board members; updating statutory language; and declaring an emergency.

Supp. 2000, Section 3-126), which relates to educational improvement plans and exemptions from statutory requirements; authorizing State Board of Education to grant certain exemption from certain certification requirements; and declaring an emergency.

[Residential Landlord and Tenant Act - effective date - emergency]

SB 439 – Maddox of the Senate and Kirby of the House.
[crimes and punishments – orders to leave institution of learning – emergency]

SB 446 – Rozell of the Senate and Wilson of the House.
An Act relating to waters and water rights; amending 82 O.S. 1991, Section 1470, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 318, O.S.L. 2000 and 1471, as amended by Section 26, Chapter 241, O.S.L. 1997 (82 O.S. Supp. 2000, Sections 1470 and 1471), which relate to the Scenic Rivers Commission; imposing certain new user fees; providing for certain landowners to operate one flotation device without paying certain fees; authorizing Commission to promulgate rules imposing new camping fee; modifying statutory language; defining terms; requiring Commission to collect fees year round; and declaring an emergency.

SB 455 – Smith of the Senate and Askins of the House.

[Oklahoma Criminal Justice System Task Force Committee – membership – emergency]

SB 475 – Shurden of the Senate and Smith (Dale) of the House.

An Act relating to game and fish; amending Section 1, Chapter 66, O.S.L. 1996, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 298, O.S.L. 1999 (29 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 4-136), which relates to license and permit requirements; authorizing the Wildlife Conservation Commission to establish a fee for certain purpose; requiring fees to be expended in certain manner; and declaring an emergency.

Supp. 2000, Section 843.1), which relates to caretaker abuse; modifying language; prohibiting verbal abuse of certain person by caretaker; setting penalty; prohibiting certain defense; defining term; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 524 – Fisher of the Senate and Mitchell of the House.

[revenue and taxation – sales taxes – codification – effective date – emergency]

SB 533 – Fisher of the Senate and Ervin and Tyler of the House.

An Act relating to public finance; amending Section 11, Chapter 342, O.S.L. 1992, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 351, O.S.L. 2000 (62 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 860), which relates to the Local Development Act; limiting period of time for which certain property may not qualify for certain ad valorem tax incentives or exemptions; and declaring an emergency.

SB 549 – Johnson of the Senate and Young of the House.

An Act relating to state government; amending Section 1, Chapter 131, O.S.L. 1998 (74 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 129.8), which relates to state lands; modifying definition of certain property; and declaring an emergency.

SB 589 – Monson of the Senate and Pope (Clay) of the House.

[revenue and taxation – income tax adjustments – emergency]

SB 643 – Littlefield of the Senate and Kirby of the House.

[amusements and sports – Oklahoma Charity Games Acts – modifying powers – effective date]

An Act relating to violence in the media; creating the Blue Ribbon Task Force on Protection of Children from Violence in the Media; providing for membership, officers, meetings, travel reimbursement and staff support; setting forth duties; providing for termination; providing for noncodification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 718 – Wilkerson of the Senate and Askins of the House.

An Act relating to criminal procedure; amending Section 1, Chapter 359, O.S.L. 1997 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 471), which relates to the Oklahoma Drug Court Act; modifying references; amending Section 2, Chapter 359, O.S.L. 1997 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 471.1), which relates to authorization of drug court programs; prohibiting blind plea or split sentence in drug court; prohibiting handling misdemeanor offense in drug court; providing exception for domestic violence case in certain situation; modifying language; requiring traditional prosecution for certain offenders; amending Section 3, Chapter 359, O.S.L. 1997 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 471.2), which relates to eligibility for drug court; clarifying language; prohibiting blind plea; prohibiting suspended and split sentences in plea agreement for drug court; prohibiting treatment in a correctional facility or jail as part of plea agreement for drug court; modifying reference; amending Section 11, Chapter 359, O.S.L. 1997 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 471.10), which relates to implementation of the

Oklahoma Drug Court Act; authorizing the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to select existing assessment instrument for use by all courts; requiring promulgation of rules, procedures and forms be completed within certain time; requiring rules to be filed within certain time with certain entities; amending 63 O.S. 1991, Section 2-503.2, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 53, O.S.L. 1998 (63 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 2-503.2), which relates to mandatory assessment for certain violations; prohibiting waiver of certain assessment; providing for assessment in event court fails to set specific amount; making certain amount payable by certain schedule; prohibiting limitation of collection time period for admission to certain program; directing the Director of the Office of State Finance to require a compliance audit annually; requiring audit certain report be distributed; and declaring an emergency.

SB 721 – Stipe of the Senate and Tyler of the House.

[roads, bridges and ferries; public utilities - outline – emergency]

SB 723 – Wilkerson of the Senate and Sweeden and Webb of the House.

An Act relating to corrections; amending 57 O.S. 1991, Section 515, which relates to probation-parole officers; modifying language; requiring the Director of the Department of Corrections to determine duties and responsibilities of certain officers; authorizing the Department of Corrections to award the identification badge to certain retiring employees; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 757 – Pruitt, Martin and Riley of the Senate and Smith (Hopper), Winchester and Nations of the House.

An Act relating to crimes and school safety; prohibiting selling or renting video game with high-violence content to persons under certain age; providing exception; providing penalties; construing what constitutes separate offense; construing certain violations to apply to storeowners concurrently with employees or agents; providing exception; defining terms; making storeowners responsible for continuing notification of all employees; prohibiting certain defense; amending Section 1, Chapter 252, O.S.L. 1996 (70 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 24-100), which relates to Safe Schools Committees; increasing committee membership; adding certain members; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 762 – Leftwich of the Senate and Lindley of the House.

An Act relating to public finance and school districts; amending 62 O.S. 1991, Section 555, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 144, O.S.L. 1997 (62 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 555), which relates to lost school district warrants; authorizing school district to reissue certain lost or destroyed warrants; and declaring an emergency.

SB 764 – Leftwich of the Senate and Benson of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act; amending 59 O.S. 1991, Section 491, as amended by Section 10, Chapter 323, O.S.L. 1994 (59 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 491), which relates to penalty for practice without license; authorizing State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to assess and collect administrative fines within specified limit for practice after revocation of

license; requiring adoption and promulgation of rules; making administrative fines additional to other penalties; clarifying reference; and declaring an emergency.

SB 767 – Wilcoxson, Williams and Johnson of the Senate and Nations of the House.

[education - salary and fringe benefits - increasing salary steps - new salary schedule – codification - effective date - emergency]

SB 774 – Douglass of the Senate and Phillips of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Professional Boxing Licensing Act; amending Section 3, Chapter 210, O.S.L. 1999 (3A O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 604.1), which relates to the Oklahoma Professional Boxing Commission; deleting obsolete language; adding third lay member; specifying initial term; and declaring an emergency.

SB 784 – Campbell of the Senate and Worthen of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Community Sentencing Act; amending Section 1, Chapter 4, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 1999 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 988.1), which relates to short title; modifying reference; amending Section 2, Chapter 4, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 1999 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 988.2), which relates to definitions; clarifying language; amending Section 3, Chapter 4, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 1999 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 988.3), which relates to purpose of the Community Sentencing Act; modifying purposes; amending Section 4, Chapter 4, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 1999 (22 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 988.4), which relates to mandatory local system; authorizing establishment of local system by certain time; deleting requirement to participate in the statewide community sentencing system; authorizing Chief Judge to set certain boundaries by certain date to form a local system; amending Section 5, Chapter 4, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 1999 (22 O.S.
