

Thirty-third Legislative Day

Thursday, March 29, 2001

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Matlock.

The roll was called with 99 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Braddock, Calvey.—2.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Associate Pastor James K. Suderman, Fairview Mennonite Brethren Church, Fairview.

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Maddux, Associate Pastor Suderman was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative day.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Maddux, Associate Pastor Suderman's remarks were ordered printed as follows:

“One of the occupational hazards of being a leader is receiving criticism (not all of it constructive by the way). When that happens, it's easy to go under, throw in the towel, or bail out. Many have faded out of leadership because of intense criticism.

I firmly believe that the leader who does anything that is different or worthwhile or visionary can count on criticism. In this regard, I appreciate the remarks made by Theodore Roosevelt:

‘It is not the critic who counts; not the man who points out how the strong man stumbled or where the doer of deeds could have done them better. The credit belongs to the man who is still in the arena; whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood; who strives valiantly; who errs, and comes short again and again, because there is no effort without error and shortcoming; who does actually try to do the deed; who knows the great enthusiasm, the great devotion, who spends himself in a worthy cause; who, at the best

knows in the end the triumph of high achievement, and who at the worst, if he fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so that his place shall never be with those cold and timid souls who know neither victory nor defeat.’

Margaret Thatcher seems to echo those words when she says, ‘If you’ve done big things in life you must expect to have excited some criticism. It’s only people who’ve done precious little who get no criticism at all.’

At the same time, it is important to sift from any criticism that which is true...that which is fact. We are foolish if we respond angrily to every criticism. Who knows, God may be using those very words to teach us some essential lessons, painful though they may be.

That seems to be what Proverbs 23:12 (TLB) is saying:

‘Don’t refuse to accept criticism; get all the help you can.’

And the following advice: A sense of humor is of paramount importance to the leader. Many of us as servant-leaders are simply too serious. Leaders must have the ability to take criticism, and they must have the ability to laugh at themselves.

‘A cheerful heart does good like medicine, but a broken spirit makes one sick.’
(Proverbs 17:22 TLB)

Of course, leaders are not only criticized often... but we can also be the most critical at times. Someone once said, ‘Two things are bad for the heart - running up stairs and running down people.’

May each of us as servant-leaders learn from criticism what we can, laugh at ourselves when we should, and encourage one another every chance we get.

Our Father, in the midst of all the traffic of our busy ways we are grateful for these few quiet moments in your presence. Be to these men and women, leaders of this great state, a quickening presence, a sustaining power, and a refuge from the confusion and commotion of our times. Bless, guide, and direct them by the limitless resources of your love and grace.

We pray for the Governor and for this Congress, as they enter upon the tasks of this day that you would make them patient in argument, charitable in judgment, slow to wrath. Equip and empower them by your grace, that they may be adequate for all the varied duties and responsibilities that confront them today.

We thank you that in Christ we have a love that can never be fathomed, a life that can never die, a peace that can never be understood, a rest that can never be disturbed, a joy that can never be diminished, a hope that can never be disappointed, a glory that can never be clouded, a light that can never be darkened, and a spiritual resource that can never be exhausted.

We pray these things in His name. AMEN”

WHEREAS, Bob Anderson has announced his retirement from the Oklahoma Tax Commission effective April 1, 2001.
