Representative Rice moved to amend **SB 166**, Page 3, Section 3, Line 5 ½ by adding a new Subsection 2 to read as follows and renumbering subsequent subsections, which amendment was declared adopted:

"2. A person licensed by this state as a physical therapist when engaging in the practice for which licensed."

Representative Coleman moved to amend **SB 166** by inserting a new Section 9 to read as follows, and renumbering subsequent section:

“SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 1991, Section 396, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 40, O.S.L. 1998 (59 O.S. Supp. 2000, Section 396), is amended to read as follows:

Section 396. There is hereby re-created, to continue until July 1, 2004, in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law, as provided by Section 3901 et seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the Oklahoma State Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors. The Board shall consist of ~~seven (7)~~ nine(9) persons, who shall be appointed by the Governor. The term of membership of each member of the Board shall be five (5) years from the expiration of the term of the member succeeded. Any member having served as a member of the Board shall be eligible for reappointment. Provided that, a member of the Board shall serve no more than two consecutive terms and any unexpired term that a member is appointed to shall not apply to this limit. The Governor shall appoint the

necessary members to the Board upon vacancies and immediately prior to the expiration of the various terms. Upon request of the Governor, appointments of a licensed embalmer and funeral director member of the Board shall be made from a list of five qualified persons submitted by the Oklahoma Funeral Directors Association. An appointment to fill a vacancy shall be for the unexpired term. A member of the Board shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualified. No person shall be a member of the Board, unless, at the time of appointment, the person is of good moral character and a resident of this state. ~~Five~~ Four of the members shall have been actively engaged in the practice of embalming and funeral directing in this state for not less than seven (7) consecutive years immediately prior to the appointment of the person, and each of such members shall have an active license as provided by ~~this act~~ the Funeral Services Licensing Act and ~~such member these members~~ shall keep ~~the~~ their license effective and remain ~~a resident~~ residents of this state during the entire time ~~the person serves~~ they serve on the Board. ~~Two~~ Four of the members of the Board shall be chosen from the general public, ~~one~~ two of whom shall, if possible, be a person licensed and actively engaged in the health care field and two of whom shall be an advocate for issues related to older persons, and ~~such~~ these members shall not be licensed funeral directors or embalmers or have any interest, directly or indirectly, in any funeral establishment or any business dealing in funeral services, supplies or equipment. One member shall be actively engaged in the practice of cremation, dehydration, or combustion of dead human remains in a facility licensed in this state. These ~~two~~ five members shall be appointed to serve for five-year terms.”

Representative Leist asked a ruling of the Presiding Officer whether the Coleman amendment is germane to **SB 166**.

The Presiding Officer ruled the point well taken and the amendment nongermane.

GENERAL ORDER

SB 575 by Herbert of the Senate and Corn et al of the House was read and considered.

Representative Corn moved to amend **SB 575** by striking the title and the enacting clause, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Corn moved to amend **SB 575**, Page 5, Section 5, Lines 10-11 by deleting the language as follows and renumbering subsequent paragraphs, which amendment was declared adopted:

"3. The marine sanitation device inspection center may charge and retain a fee of not to exceed Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for the removal of the valve lock."

Representative Corn moved to amend **SB 575**, Page 7, Section 6, Lines 6-8 by deleting the language as follows and renumbering subsequent paragraphs, which amendment was declared adopted:

"2. Applications for a permit for an official marine sanitation device inspection center shall be accompanied by a fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00). Each annual renewal thereafter shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00)."

Representative Corn moved to amend **SB 575**, Page 9, Section 7, Line 20 through Page 10, Line 16 by deleting all of the language as follows which amendment was declared adopted:

"C. Centers shall charge and collect the applicable inspection fee of:

1. Not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each marine sanitation device vessel equipped with a permanently installed marine sanitation device which is outfitted with a valve and which has been inspected pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Marine Sanitation Act. Fees collected shall be distributed as follows:

a. Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be remitted to the Department of Public Safety to be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund. Such fees shall be expended solely for the purpose of administering the Oklahoma Marine Sanitation Act and conducting a marine sanitation public awareness and education program, and

b. the balance, in an amount not to exceed Five Dollars (\$5.00), shall be retained by the center;

2. Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each marine sanitation device vessel equipped with a permanently installed marine sanitation device which is not outfitted with a valve and which has been inspected pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Marine Sanitation Act. The fee shall be retained by the inspection center; or

3. Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each marine sanitation device vessel which is not equipped with a permanently installed marine sanitation device. The fee shall be retained by the center."

Representative Corn moved to amend **SB 575** by deleting all of Section 17 as follows, and renumbering subsequent sections, which amendment was declared adopted:

"SECTION 17. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 1991, Section 4019, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4019. A. 1. The registration fees ~~herein~~ levied upon vessels and motors located within this state pursuant to the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act shall be due on the first day of July each year and shall become delinquent on the first day of August thereafter.

2. Any person owning a vessel or motor subject to the provisions of this subsection and failing or refusing to file application for the registration of such vessel or motor and to pay the annual registration fees as provided by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act, on or before the 31st day of July each year, shall be deemed delinquent.

B. On the registration of new vessels or new motor purchased in this state and on new or used vessels or motors used in this state or brought into this state between July 1 and September 30, inclusive, of any year the payment of the full annual registration and license fee shall be collected; and between October 1 and December 31, inclusive, of any year the payment of three-fourths (3/4) the annual registration and license fee shall be collected; and between January 1 and March 31, inclusive, of any year the payment of one-half (1/2) the annual registration and license fee shall be collected; and between April 1 and June 30, inclusive, of any year the payment of one-fourth (1/4) of the annual registration and license fee shall be collected.

C. 1. Effective July 1, 2002, three-fourths (3/4) of the registration fees herein levied upon vessels and motors located within this state shall be due on July 1, 2002, and shall become delinquent on August 1, 2002.

2. Any person owning a vessel or motor subject to the provisions of this subsection and failing or refusing to file application for the registration of such vessel or motor and to pay the annual registration fees as provided by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act, on or before July 31, 2002, shall be deemed delinquent.

D. Effective July 1, 2002, on the registration of a new vessel or new motor purchased in this state and on a new or used vessel or motor used in this state or brought into this state between:

1. July 1, 2002, and September 30, 2002, inclusive, the payment of three-fourths (3/4) of the annual registration and license fee shall be collected;

2. October 1, 2002, and December 31, 2002, inclusive, the payment of one-half (1/2) of the annual registration and license fee shall be collected; or

3. January 1, 2003, and March 31, 2003, inclusive, the payment of one-fourth (1/4) of the annual registration and license fee shall be collected.

E. 1. Effective April 1, 2003, the registration fees herein levied upon vessels and motors located within this state shall be due on April 1 of each year and shall become delinquent on May 1 thereafter.

2. Any person owning a vessel or motor subject to the provisions of this subsection and failing or refusing to file application for the registration of such vessel or motor and to pay the annual registration fees as provided by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act, on or before April 30 of each year, shall be deemed delinquent.

F. On the registration of a new vessel or new motor purchased in this state and on a new or used vessel or motor used in this state or brought into this state between:

1. April 1 and June 30, inclusive, of any year the payment of the full annual registration and license fee shall be collected;

2. July 1 and September 30, inclusive, of any year the payment of three-fourths (3/4) the annual registration and license fee shall be collected;

3. October 1 and December 31, inclusive, of any year the payment of one-half (1/2) the annual registration and license fee shall be collected; or

4. January 1 and March 30, inclusive, of any year the payment of one-fourth (1/4) of the annual registration and license fee shall be collected."

Representative Corn moved to amend **SB 575** by deleting all of Section 19 as follows and renumbering subsequent sections, which amendment was declared adopted:

"SECTION 19. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 1991, Section 4024, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4024. A. In the event a new vessel or a new motor is not registered within thirty (30) calendar days from the date purchased in this state by a resident of this state, the penalty shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), provided that in no event shall the penalty exceed an amount equal to the registration fee. The rate of the registration fee shall be fixed and determined by the date of the sale by the dealer of said new vessel or motor to the purchaser.

B. If a new or used vessel or motor is brought into Oklahoma by a resident of this state and is not registered within thirty (30) calendar days from the date such vessel or motor enters the state as required by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act, the penalty shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), provided that in no event shall the penalty exceed an amount equal to the registration fee.

C. If a vessel or motor is purchased or is brought into Oklahoma by a nonresident of this state and such vessel or motor remains over sixty (60) calendar days and is not registered as required by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act, the penalty shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).

D. If a vessel which is twenty-four (24) feet or more in length or which is equipped with one or more permanently installed marine sanitation devices is docked in this state over thirty (30) calendar days and is not registered as required by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act, the penalty shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).

E. Any person in this state owning a vessel or motor subject to the provisions of this subsection and failing or refusing to file application for the registration of such vessel or motor and to pay the registration fee as required by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act, within one(1) month after the expiration date, shall be deemed delinquent and there shall be added a penalty of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) per day on the registration fee for each day such registration is delinquent. The penalty for failure to register shall accrue for a three-month calendar period. Thereafter, the penalty shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), provided that in no event shall the penalty exceed an amount equal to the registration fee.

~~E.~~ F. The failure to register any vessel or motor as required by the Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act shall in addition to penalties, subject such vessel or motor to the seizure provisions as provided in the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act."

Except as provided in subsection C of this section, a police officer shall be not less than twenty-one (21) nor more than forty-five (45) years of age when accepted for membership in the System. The State Board shall have authority to deny or revoke membership of any person submitting false information in such person's membership application. The State Board shall have final authority in determining eligibility for membership in the System, pursuant to the provisions of this article.

B. Except as provided in subsection C of this section, the police chief or assistant police chief of any participating municipality may be exempt from membership in the System or may become a member provided the requirements of this section are met at the time of employment.

C. A former member of the System who terminates from covered employment and who has neither retired from the System nor entered the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan and is later employed in a covered position with a participating municipality shall not be denied eligibility to become a member of the System because he or she is forty-five (45) years of age or older. If such member has withdrawn his or her contributions prior to re-entering the System and the member desires to receive credit for such prior service, then the member shall pay back such contributions and interest pursuant to Section 50-111.1 of this title.”
