Thursday, February 8, 2001

Representative Turner moved to amend **HB 1217** by striking the title, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Turner moved to amend **HB 1217**, Page 4, Section 2, Line 2 by deleting the language “Any nonlegislative members” and inserting in lieu thereof the word “Members” and Lines 4-6 by deleting the language “Legislative members of the Committee shall be reimbursed from the house in which they serve pursuant to Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.”, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Turner moved to amend **HB 1217**, Page 4, Section 2, Line 13 by adding after the word “of” and before the word “members” the word “the” and by deleting the language “present at a meeting” and inserting in lieu thereof the language “on the Advisory Committee”, which amendment was declared adopted.

Representative Turner moved that **HB 1217** be advanced from General Order, which motion was declared adopted.
