

Sixth Legislative Day

Monday, February 12, 2001

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Matlock.

The roll was called with 99 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Glover, Stanley.—2.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Reverend Dennis Clark, Sunray Baptist Church, Purcell.

Upon motion of Representative Mitchell, Reverend Clark was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative week.

HB 1122 by Winchester of the House and Cain of the Senate was read and considered.

Representative Winchester moved to amend **HB 1122** by striking the title, the enacting clause and the entire measure and inserting in lieu thereof a floor substitute, which amendment was declared adopted. (Xerox copies for Members)

Representative Coleman moved to amend the floor substitute, Page 4, Section 1, Line 1/2 by adding new subsections G and H to read as follows, which amendment was declared adopted:

“G. In implementing the provisions of this act, tracking mechanisms shall be instituted to determine how many babies are abandoned and whether the lives of those babies are saved.

H. The provisions of this act shall be subject to a sunset provision. In 2003, the provisions of the act shall be reviewed to determine if the legislation is successful.”
