2. Two members of the Senate, one of whom shall be a Republican and one of whom shall be a Democrat, to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and

3. One member, to be appointed by the Governor.

D. The Oversight Committee shall monitor and review all activities of the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security.

E. It shall be the duty of all departments, officers, agencies and employees of the state to cooperate with the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security in carrying out the functions of that office. Failure to cooperate may result in removal from office.",

WHEREAS, one suggestion to address the fair cash value increases is to limit property tax increases for certain kinds of real property; and

WHEREAS, because of the impact to public schools and other ad valorem tax recipients, any limitation on property tax increases needs to be thoroughly studied.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 48TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

- A. There is created the Task Force on Ad Valorem Tax Limitations.
- B. The Task Force shall consist of eleven (11) members to be appointed as follows:
 - 1. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint the following individuals:
 - a. two members of the House of Representatives,
 - b. one county assessor from a county with a population of fifty thousand (50,000) or less, and
 - c. one person representing a school district located in a county with a population of more than fifty thousand (50,000);
 - 2. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint the following individuals:
 - a. two members of the Senate,
 - b. one county assessor from a county with a population of more than fifty thousand (50,000), and
 - c. one person representing a school district located in a county with a population of fifty thousand (50,000) or less; and
 - 3. The Governor shall appoint the following individuals:
 - a. one member of the State Board of Education,
 - b. one person who is a certified public accountant, and
 - c. one person owning real property in the state.

All appointments pursuant to this subsection shall be made no later than July 1, 2002.

C. The Task Force shall elect from its members a chairperson. The Task Force shall meet at such times and places as it deems necessary to perform its duties as specified in this section. Meetings shall be held at the call of the chair.

D. Legislative members of the Task Force shall be reimbursed by their appointing authorities for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with Section 456 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. All other members of the Task Force shall be reimbursed by their appointing authorities for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

E. The Oklahoma Tax Commission and the House of Representatives and the Senate staff shall provide such staff support as is required by the Task Force.

F. The duty of the Task Force shall be to study and review the impact that a limitation of property tax increases for real property would have on public school districts and other recipients of ad valorem taxes.

G. The Task Force shall set forth its findings or recommendations in a report to the Governor and the Legislature no later than December 15, 2002. The Task Force shall be terminated as of January 1, 2003.”
