SB 971 – By Price of the Senate and Pope (Clay) of the House.
[revenue and taxation - motor vehicle taxes - effective date – emergency]

SB 1308 – By Easley of the Senate and Leist of the House.
[Oklahoma Clean Air Act – city-county authority - fees - effective date]

SB 1312 – By Easley of the Senate and Rice of the House.

An Act relating to electric cooperatives; amending 18 O.S. 2001, Section 437.2, which relates to powers of electric cooperatives; removing restriction on funds lent by certain private utilities; authorizing cooperatives to participate with, jointly own or operate or enter into loans with certain business entities for certain purposes; and declaring an emergency.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2001, Sections 6-101.13 and 24-101.3, which relate to administrator due process procedures and out-of-school suspensions; deleting redundant language; authorizing certain school district boards of education to utilize hearing officer to conduct certain hearings; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1544 – By Coffee and Leftwich of the Senate and Nance of the House.

[Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission - accept title – codification - effective date]

SB 1632 – By Pruitt of the Senate and Winchester of the House.

An Act relating to poor persons; requiring the Department of Human Services to establish a service delivery system under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program; providing for redemption of vouchers for TANF services with specified providers; providing that vouchers be made payable for the provision of specified TANF services; requiring the Department to establish specified procedure for provision of services to TANF recipients; requiring promulgation of rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
