

Forty-third Legislative Day

Thursday, April 18, 2002

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Matlock.

The roll was called with 100 Members present.

The following Member was excused: Stanley.—1.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Gregory Riether, Ascension Lutheran Church, Tulsa.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Peters, the remarks of Pastor Riether were ordered printed in full as follows:

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you for bringing us in safety to this new day. We thank you for the work that you have accomplished, through us already this week. We look forward to this new day where we ask once again for your wisdom, for your guidance. We might have your mind as we think about issues. We might do what is right and just and merciful and loving. For we ask this in Jesus name.

Amen

You may be seated.

Well I want to say it's just an incredible honor to be here all this week and then today and to have your ear for five minutes. I get five minutes. I don't want to waste any of that time so I want to read you a passage that is in no particular way inspiring or encouraging or uplifting, but it's from the Bible and it is 2 Samuel 16. You may recall this little part in the life of King David. It says when King David came to Bahurim behold, there came out from there a man of the family of the house of Saul whose name was Shimei the son of Gera. He

came out cursing continually as he came and he threw stones at David and all the servants of King David and all the people and all the mighty men were at his right hand and his left and thus Shimei said when he cursed get out, get out you man of bloodshed and worthless fellow. The Lord is returned upon you all the bloodshed of the house of Saul and whose place you have reigned and the Lord has given the kingdom into the hand of your son, Absalom And behold you are taken in your own evil; for you are a man of bloodshed. So David and his men went on the way and Shimei went along the hillside parallel with them and so he went and he cursed and cast stones and threw dust at him.

Well, that's an uplifting passage isn't it? But strangely enough when I read this, this past week, I thought about you, not in a place of casting the stones, but as being on the receiving end I'm sure of many stones that have been cast your way over the days and months and perhaps even years as you have served faithfully in our state legislature. Absalom had risen up against King David. Absalom is David's son. I mean it doesn't get much worse than that. It was a bad day in the life of King David. Absalom had driven David and his men out of Jerusalem. David and his men and his whole family - they are fleeing for their lives. On top of that, which is bad enough, on top of that there's this fellow Shimei who is kind of standing on the crest of a hill as David and his men and family are passing beneath and he's cursing him and he's throwing stones and throwing dust and dirt at him - the original mud slinging going on at this event and he's cursing David. David who's the greatest king of Israel the greatest king to ever rule Israel a just man. A man who sought to serve God's people in justice and mercy and love, poured his heart out as a king, gave himself completely over to the kingship and rule of Israel and here's this little punk of a man who is casting stones and cursing him and none of the good things that David did seemed to matter at that point. Shimei is cursing him and you can just hear him say the words that maybe have been spoken to all of us one time or another - "You're no good, you are no good. David you are the worst king ever. You can't do anything right. God is done with you. He has replaced you with Absalom."

Do you ever feel that way? That God is done with you? All those days when you have been the lightning rod for criticism. Who is it that gives us those words that say you're no good, you can't do anything right, God must be done with you? That's not God that does that - that's the devil. You've had those days where you've come to the end of the day and it was a bill that you happened to carry that day and you got a thumping, the press gave you a thumping, and your peers gave you a thumping, and finally you got back to your hotel room and mom called and she gave you a thumping. It's just one of those long days and you feel like maybe you're wearing that big bullseye on you that says throw rocks here, please. What do you do? Well the Bible says David strengthened himself in the Lord. David got by himself and he strengthened himself in the Lord. What does that mean? It means we get alone with God and we think about the foundations that your life is built on. So when we are down we get alone with God. I want to just tell you - very quickly - three things that you can know are true for you. The first thing is that God has called you to the position that you are in. You know how you know that? Because you're here. So God's not done with you even when other people would like God to be done with you. Okay? God's not done with you. We know that God has called you here and that God is going to continue to use you and that should be an encouragement. The second thing is that as you know your stand on justice and mercy, any stand on justice and mercy and truth and love is never in vain even when it doesn't win over everyone. Sometimes doing the right thing means you are going to be despised. Jesus himself said "Woe to you when all men speak well of you." And we want all men to speak well of us, but it doesn't work that way

because not everybody's agendas are pure. And then the third thing that you can remember is that at the end of the day you know when you get back to wherever you go, you can know that God's love for you is a gracious love. Even when you've done something stupid, that God's love loves you past that. Even when you've failed, God's love, loves you past that. And he calls us not to throw stones at us and to kick us even more but to encourage you and the position he has called you to today to stand you back on your feet and encourage you so that you will carry out his mission of justice and mercy and love in this great state of Oklahoma in which we serve. Would you pray with me.

Heavenly Father, I ask your blessing on these men and women who have given of themselves to serve the people of this state. I thank you for each one of them. I pray you would be their encouragement today. Let them know that you are in their corner and that you love them and that you have called them. Give them strength to endure the rocks that are thrown. Give them hides of rhinoceroses and the hearts of doves. For we ask of it in Jesus name.
