

Fifty-first Legislative Day

Thursday, May 2, 2002

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Matlock.

The roll was called with 96 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Benson, Glover, Piatt, Stanley, Webb.—5.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Reverend Dennis Gullion, Youth Minister, Crossroads Cathedral, Oklahoma City.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

REMARKS

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Cargill, the remarks of Reverend Gullion were ordered printed in full as follows:

“Lord, we thank you for this day and what it represents. We ask, God, that You would join us in this Session and help us Lord with our decisions. May our thoughts and may our spoken words and motives be pure and honoring to you. We give you thanks. In Your Name we pray, Amen.

I want to say thanks so much for allowing me to be a part of this Session this week. We learn so much in school and then you actually get to see it in action. So thank you. It has truly been a privilege and a joy to be here this week and to be a part of the elite of Oklahoma.

My wife is not from this Great State and she tells me that she can tell a true Oklahoman. I asked how she can tell a true Oklahoman? She said, 'When the tornado siren goes off, they are the ones standing in the front yard looking for the tornado'. I have to admit I like the severe weather and it is a lot of fun. If I didn't choose this profession, I would probably be a storm chaser. She says that I am definitely from Oklahoma.

At this time, I know that many of you are concerned about your colleague, Rep. Glover, and I would like to offer up a quick prayer for his touch and that he would get through this quickly.

'Father, we come to you as the Great Physician. We know, God, that you can reach down from heaven and touch our colleague, Rep. Glover. We ask, Lord, that you would do that. We pray for the family members and the loved ones and we ask, God, that you would be with them. Give them peace during this time. It is in your Son's name that we pray, Amen.'

If I were to ask you who are the greatest leaders of all times, whether it be present or past, I know that every one of you would have possibly your own answer to that question. Some of you might say that John F. Kennedy was the greatest leader of all time and some of you might say that Ronald Reagan was the greatest leader of all time. Some of you might have a bigger world view and look to someone like Christopher Columbus and say that he was the greatest leader.

But whoever that you say, there is one person that stands head and shoulders above every leader that we have thought of in our mind. I want to bring to you some of the things that he has on his resume that makes him, I believe, the greatest leader of all times.

His name is Jesus. He has proven to be the greatest leader of all times. Let me give you a few reasons why I think he is the greatest leader of all times. As a pastor, and I know as a public official, we want to be people of influence. People who can lead and motivate people to do things. This man, Jesus, has done just that. Let me give you a few things on his resume.

When he was born, he divided time into two segments – B.C. and A.D. He has had an incredible influence on our world today. In America, we celebrate two holidays that we recognize simply based on his birth and death. You know those, as well as I do, they are Christmas and Easter. In America, Christmas is the most popular holiday that we celebrate. He is still, after 2,000 years, he is still influencing people. He is still changing their lives. He is radically motivating them to live a life and to be worthy of his teachings.

What makes Jesus such a great leader? Why is he considered, in my view, the greatest leader of all times? What do we use to measure a great leader? We actually measure great leaders by people that follow them and those that have the greater following. Maybe it is those who have the greater influence and those who are following. It is said that if a man thinks he is a leader and he is leading and when he looks back and finds no one following, he is not leading... he is simply taking a walk! Leadership is about people that we can influence. I know that in this room, we have great leaders and great influence.

So what makes this man such a great leader? What is it that causes him to stand above the rest of everyone else. While there are many characteristics that we can list, just for the sake of time because I know you want to get back home and see your family, like I do, I'll make this short and brief. If you want to make a study, there are many more characteristics than the three that I've placed on this list.

First, he was a man of passion. I know that you took this role because you have passion. Passion is what motivates man. Passion is what drives us to do those crazy things that people say, 'why did you do that'. Being here this week, I've had the chance to ask

some of you, ‘why would you become a politician? It’s like being in a glass house, just like a pastor.’ Everyone is watching and waiting to see what your life represents. Those I asked said it is ‘passion... we want to make a difference’. We don’t just want to sit back and allow things to go on. It is passion. I know that many of you have that.

Secondly, he was a man of integrity. He was a man of his word. I know that we don’t have to go very far in politics, and you know as well as I do, the importance of integrity. The importance of being a man or woman of your word. We know that a reputation can go a long way. Jesus was a man of integrity. When he said it, you knew that he was going to follow through with it. Men and women, I say that we need to be men and women of integrity. People of their word. People who say and follow through with what they say they’ll do.

The final thing that I have of why I think this man the greatest leader of all times, is that he was truly, truly a servant. So why do you become a politician, or even a pastor? It is because we want to serve people. We want to reach out and to help them, to motivate them, and to see the greater come out in them. As a matter of fact, Jesus simply said, ‘I came not to be served, but to serve.’ To help those succeed around me. As a youth pastor, I have many adult leaders who are not paid but simply volunteer to work with teenagers. Every Wednesday night, including last night, I had the opportunity to stand in front of 200 to 300 teenagers from the south Oklahoma City area. I have 50 to 60 adult couples who want to be a part of this and to serve. They come and they serve because they want to invest in our students and in our young people... not just to be good, but to be great. To be great. Jesus was a servant. He considered others more important than himself. Whether or not you are a follower of Jesus, I say that you cannot get away from the facts that he is truly the greatest leader of all times.

As people of influence, and as a young man like myself who wants to make an impact on the world, I want to learn from the greatest leader of all times. His name is Jesus. I believe that. Amen.
