BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2001, Section 150.6a, is
amended to read as follows:

Section 150.6a A. Effective ~~October 1, 2000~~ January 1, 2005,
the annual salaries for the Deputy Director, and the positions
within the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, as set out in
this section, shall be in accordance and conformity with the
following salary schedule, exclusive of longevity pay as authorized
by Section 840-2.18 of ~~Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes~~ this title:

1. Deputy Director:

The salary of the Deputy Director shall
be ninety-five percent (95%) of that
received by the Director;

2. Division Director:

The salary of a Division Director shall be ninety percent (90%) of that received by the Director;

3. Agent I (OSBI), Criminalist I:

Minimum \$33,500.00, Mid-point \$41,875.00, Maximum \$50,250.00

4. Agent II (OSBI), Criminalist II:

Minimum \$39,250.00, Mid-point \$49,062.00, Maximum \$58,875.00

5. ~~Special~~ Agent III (OSBI), ~~Senior~~ Criminalist III:

Minimum \$46,250.00, Mid-point \$57,812.00, Maximum \$69,375.00

6. Agent/~~Deputy Inspector~~ IV (OSBI),

Criminalist ~~Supervisor~~ IV:

Minimum \$51,000.00, Mid-point \$63,750.00, Maximum \$76,500.00

7. Agent/~~Inspector~~ V (OSBI), Criminalist

~~Administrator~~ V:

Minimum \$56,000.00, Mid-point \$70,000.00, Maximum \$84,000.00

B. The annual increases provided for in this section shall be subject to the availability of funds within the budget of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 2005."
