An Act relating to the State Election Board;  
requiring budgeting in certain categories and  
amounts; providing for duties and compensation of  
employees; limiting the salary of the Secretary;  
making appropriations nonfiscal; providing an  
effective date; and declaring an emergency.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause  
and entire bill and insert

"An Act relating to the State Election Board;  
requiring budgeting in certain categories and  
amounts; requiring performance measures; providing  
for duties and compensation of employees; making  
appropriations nonfiscal; providing an effective  
date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, the State  
Election Board shall budget all funds in the following categories  
and amounts:

Administration/Data Processing	\$4,974,780.00	\$10,355,780.00
Voter Registration	111,000.00	125,000.00
Voter Outreach	0.00	353,121.00
Election Management	1,986,349.00	3,000,000.00
HAVA Title III	<u>0.00</u>	<u>36,000,000.00</u>
TOTAL	\$7,072,129.00	\$49,833,901.00

The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for  
each budget category.

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the State Election Board by law shall be set by the Secretary of the State Election Board.

SECTION 3. The appropriations made by Sections 42 and 43 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2007 of the 2nd Session of the 49th Oklahoma Legislature shall not be subject to fiscal year limitations and shall be available for encumbrance and expenditure purposes for a period of thirty (30) months from the date this act is approved.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2004.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
