AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the stricken title, enacting
clause and entire bill and insert

"[professions and occupations - cosmetologists -
licenses -
effective date]

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 199.11, as
amended by Section 6, Chapter 56, O.S.L. 2003 (59 O.S. Supp. 2003,
Section 199.11), is amended to read as follows:

Section 199.11 The State Board of Cosmetology is hereby
authorized to deny, revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew any license,
certificate, or registration that it is authorized to issue under
the Oklahoma Cosmetology Act for any of the following causes:

1. ~~Conviction of a felony as shown by a certified copy of the
record of the court;~~

~~2.~~ Gross malpractice or gross incompetence;

~~3.~~ 2. Fraud practiced in obtaining a license or registration;

~~4.~~ 3. A license or certificate holder's continuing to practice
while afflicted with an infectious, contagious, or communicable
disease;

~~5.~~ 4. Habitual drunkenness or addiction to use of habit forming drugs;

~~6.~~ 5. Advertising by means of statements known to be false or deceptive;

~~7.~~ 6. Continued or flagrant violation of any rules of the Board, or continued practice by an operator in a cosmetology salon wherein violations of the rules of the Board are being committed within the knowledge of the operator;

~~8.~~ 7. Failure to display license or certificate as required by the Oklahoma Cosmetology Act;

~~9.~~ 8. Continued practice of cosmetology after expiration of a license therefor;

~~10.~~ 9. Employment by a salon owner or manager of any person to perform any of the practices of cosmetology who is not duly licensed to perform the services; or

~~11.~~ 10. Practicing cosmetology in an immoral or unprofessional manner.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2004."
