**SB 727** by Smith of the Senate and Paulk of the House was read and considered.

Representative Jones moved to amend **SB 727** by inserting a new Section 2 to read as follows, and renumbering subsequent section, which amendment was declared adopted:

“SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 1151.1, as amended by Section 40 of Enrolled House Bill 1816 of the 1st Session of the 49th Oklahoma Legislature, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1151.1 A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, golf carts or all-terrain vehicles shall not be registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act.

B. Except as otherwise provided in this section and pursuant to the exception provided in subsection E of Section 1151 of this title, golf carts or all-terrain vehicles shall not be operated on the highways or turnpikes of the state.

C. All-terrain vehicles owned by a city or golf carts may be operated on city streets if:

1. The municipal governing body has adopted an ordinance governing the operation of golf carts or all-terrain vehicles on city streets; ~~and~~

2. Operation occurs during daylight hours only; and  
 3. Municipalities have established routes and conditions for the operation of golf carts by physically disabled persons as defined by Section 15-112 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

D. Golf carts may be operated on roadways under the following conditions:

1. The board of county commissioners of a county has approved the location of golf cart traffic on roadways within the county;
2. The roadway has a posted speed limit of twenty-five (25) miles per hour or less;
3. The roadway is located in an unincorporated area; and
4. Appropriate signage, cautioning motorists of the possibility of golf cart traffic, is erected by the board of county commissioners.”

Representative Paulk moved that **SB 727** be advanced from General Order, which motion was declared adopted.
