A Concurrent Resolution designating a certain bridge on Interstate Highway 40 as the Bob Wood Memorial Bridge; providing for placement of permanent markers; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2001, this state lost an outstanding citizen with the passing of Mr. Bob Wood, longtime resident of Del City, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Bob Wood was an exceptional individual who actively worked for the betterment of his community; and

WHEREAS, Bob Wood was a civic leader who had served as a Del City councilman, as president of the Del City Lions Club and as a member of the Del City Chamber of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, Bob Wood was an honorary Oklahoma County reserve deputy sheriff and a member of the American Legion; and

WHEREAS, Bob Wood, who understood the importance of nurturing future generations, loved children; and

WHEREAS, Bob Wood was a Shriner who organized the Del City Shriner Parade for 16 years and beginning in 1971, performed as a Shriner India clown, entertaining children at the Shriner's Christmas party for children, one of his favorite activities; and

WHEREAS, Bob Wood loved music and, in his capacity as owner and founder of the Del City Music Recording Studio, assisted many artists in their careers, including Conway Twitty, Reba McEntire, and Vince Gill; and

WHEREAS, Bob Wood will long be remembered for his role in founding the Country Music Hall of Fame in Del City; and

WHEREAS, wonderful human beings like Mr. Bob Wood are rare and rare gifts should be commemorated and remembered.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 49TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the bridge on Interstate Highway 40 that extends over Sunnyslane Road in Del City, Oklahoma, shall be designated the "Bob Wood Memorial Bridge" in honor of a truly great citizen of this state.

THAT the Oklahoma Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers to be placed on the bridge bearing the name Bob Wood Memorial Bridge.

THAT copies of this resolution be dispatched to Mrs. Carolyn Wood, widow of Mr. Bob Wood, and to the Secretary of Transportation.
