A Concurrent Resolution extending a special commendation to the General Motors Corporation for their speedy decision to rebuild; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, during the late afternoon and evening of Thursday, May 8, 2003, a series of severe storms containing tornadoes ripped through the metropolitan Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, area; and

WHEREAS, the assembly plant of General Motors, the largest public employer in the State of Oklahoma, was hit particularly hard by a tornado Thursday evening, ripping apart the paint shop, doing other major damage to the body shop, destroying the cars of about 70 employees and many newly assembled Chevy TrailBlazers and Envoys scheduled for delivery; and

WHEREAS, General Motors has a fiscal impact on the State of Oklahoma of about \$1 billion a year, employing approximately 3,000 Oklahomans. General Motors officials have announced the plant will be rebuilt with no loss of jobs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION  
OF THE 49TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature commends the management of  
General Motors on their dedication to the State of Oklahoma and  
their desire to rebuild and reopen their assembly plant in Oklahoma  
City, Oklahoma, and remain the largest employer in the State of  
Oklahoma.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to officials of  
the General Motors Assembly Plant.
