An Act relating to public health and safety;  
authorizing public agencies in certain cities to use  
nine-one-one service information to notify the public  
in certain situations; directing certain public  
agencies to establish confidentiality procedures and  
methods; defining certain term; providing for  
codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2815.1 of Title 63, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Nine-one-one emergency telephone service information may be  
used by a public law enforcement or public health agency in a city  
having a population of more than three hundred thousand (300,000)  
according to the latest Federal Decennial Census for the purpose of  
placing outgoing emergency calls that notify the public of an  
emergency or provide to the public information relative to an  
emergency.

B. Any public law enforcement or public health agency in a city  
having a population of more than three hundred thousand (300,000)  
according to the latest Federal Decennial Census that uses nine-one-  
one emergency telephone service information for the purposes set  
forth in subsection A of this section shall establish methods and  
procedures that ensure the confidentiality of the information.

C. For purposes of this section "nine-one-one emergency  
telephone service information" shall mean the name, address and  
telephone number of a service user of a local exchange telephone  
company.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective January 1, 2004.
