WHEREAS, the care and proper management of our natural resources
are essential to the quality of life and the future of all
Oklahomans as well as to Oklahoma's economy; and

WHEREAS, Conservation Districts are the primary local natural
resource connection for the citizens of Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Conservation Districts provide the delivery system for
a number of critical conservation programs including upstream flood
control, soil and water conservation cost-share, abandoned mine land
reclamation, nonpoint source water quality, and student and adult
conservation education; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Legislature recognizes the important work
that Conservation Districts perform for the State of Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 49TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:

to Oklahoma's 88 Conservation Districts for their efforts.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature hereby proclaims March 10, 2004,
as "Conservation Day" at the State Capitol.
