An Act relating to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; making an appropriation to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; stating purpose; amending Section 3 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1231 of the 1st Session of the 49th Oklahoma Legislature, which relates to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; modifying budgetary limitations; exempting certain expenditures from budgetary and employee limitations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation from any monies not otherwise appropriated from the Special Cash Fund of the State Treasury the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation by law for oil field investigations.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 3 of Enrolled House Bill No. 1231 of the 1st Session of the 49th Oklahoma Legislature is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed upon the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation by law shall be set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed Seventy-four Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-two Dollars (\$74,222.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2004, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. Budgetary and employee limitations otherwise imposed upon agencies by law shall not apply to expenditures by state agencies made from appropriations and transfers made by this act.

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2003.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
