A Resolution commending the Tulsa Union High School Boys Basketball team for winning the 2004 Class 6A State Boys Basketball Championship; praising their perseverance; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Tulsa Union High School Boys Basketball team, the Redskins, have participated in the Class 6A state playoffs eleven times without winning the championship; and

WHEREAS, in the 2002 Class 6A State Boys Basketball Championship game, the Putnam City Pirates came back from being down by six points to defeat the Redskins 55-53. In the 2003 Class 6A quarterfinals, Putnam City outscored the Redskins 78-73; and

WHEREAS, on Saturday, March 13, 2004, at the Mabee Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma, the Redskins defeated the Pirates by a score of 65-51 to win the 2004 Class 6A State Boys Basketball Championship, the first ever for Tulsa Union High School.

the Redskins for winning the school's first-ever boys basketball state title.
