6 ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1139 - By: GILBERT of the House and HORNER
7 of the Senate.

8 An Act relating to counties and county officers; authorizing
9 counties to set curfews by resolution; providing notice;
10 providing for assistance; providing for posting signs;
11 providing for reimbursement of certain costs; providing
12 penalty; providing for codification; and providing an
13 effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 339.6 of Title 19, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. The board of county commissioners of any county of this
19 state having a population of more than five hundred thousand
20 (500,000) persons according to the last federal decennial census, by
21 resolution, may determine a curfew **for juveniles** that will apply to
22 all unincorporated areas of the county. The parameters of the
23 curfew shall be determined by the board.

24 B. The board shall provide public notice of the curfew in a
25 newspaper of general circulation in the county. The notice shall be
26 published once weekly for a period of four (4) continuous weeks.

1 C. The county shall correspond and work in conjunction with any
2 appropriate state agency, if assistance is required in producing
3 signs and posting the curfew.

4 D. The county shall post curfew information, as determined
5 pursuant to subsections A through C of this section, on the county
6 line marker where any state highway enters a county and at all off-
7 ramps where interstate highways or turnpikes enter a county, unless
8 a state agency has such jurisdiction to properly post signs. The
9 appropriate board of county commissioners shall reimburse any state
10 agency that may assist for the full cost of the required signage.

11 E. Any person convicted of a curfew violation pursuant to this
12 section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a minimum
13 fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00). Any person convicted of a
14 second or subsequent curfew violation shall be guilty of a
15 misdemeanor and be subject to a fine of up to One Hundred Dollars
16 (\$100.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not
17 less than one (1) day, nor more than thirty (30) days, or by both
18 fine and imprisonment.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2003.
