ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1650 - By: TIBBS, BALKMAN, NANCE and PETERS  
of the House and RILEY of the Senate.

An Act relating to public health and safety; authorizing certain public agencies to use nine-one-one service information to notify the public in certain situations; directing certain public agencies to establish confidentiality procedures and methods; defining certain term; **providing for cost of reverse nine-one-one service; authorizing Oklahoma Corporation Commission to determine cost;** providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2815.1 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Nine-one-one emergency telephone service information may be used by a public law enforcement or public health agency for the purpose of placing out-going emergency calls that notify the public of an emergency or provide to the public information relative to an emergency.

B. Any public law enforcement or public health agency that uses nine-one-one emergency telephone service information for the purposes set forth in subsection A of this section shall establish

1 methods and procedures that ensure the confidentiality of the  
2 information.

3 C. For purposes of this section "nine-one-one emergency  
4 telephone service information" shall mean the name, address and  
5 telephone number of a service user of a local exchange telephone  
6 company.

7 **SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified**  
8 **in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2815.2 of Title 63, unless there**  
9 **is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:**

10 The reasonable cost incurred for nine-one-one services pursuant  
11 to Section 1 of this act shall be recoverable by any telephone  
12 service provider from the Oklahoma Universal Service Fund. The  
13 Oklahoma Corporation Commission shall determine such reasonable  
14 cost.

15 **SECTION 3.** It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
16 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
