SENATE BILL NO. 1110 - By: CAIN of the Senate and GILBERT and EDDINS of the House.

An Act relating to public health and safety; amending 63 O.S. 2001, Section 1-227.9, which relates to the Child Abuse Training and Coordination Council; expanding membership; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2001, Section 1-227.9, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1-227.9 A. There is hereby created the Child Abuse Training and Coordination Council.

B. The Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth shall appoint a Child Abuse Training and Coordination Council which shall be composed of ~~twenty-one (21)~~ twenty-two (22) members, as follows:

- 1. One member shall be a representative of child welfare services within the Department of Human Services;
- 2. One member shall be a representative of juvenile services within the Department of Human Services;
- 3. One member shall be a representative of maternal and child health services within the State Department of Health;

1 4. One member shall be a representative of the State Department
2 of Health;

3 5. One member shall be a representative of the State Department
4 of Education;

5 6. One member shall be a representative of the Department of
6 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services;

7 7. One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma State
8 Medical Association and shall be a member of the Oklahoma Chapter of
9 the American Academy of Pediatrics;

10 8. One member shall be a representative of the judiciary;

11 9. One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma
12 Osteopathic Association and shall be a pediatric osteopathic
13 physician;

14 10. One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma
15 Coalition on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault;

16 11. One member shall be a representative of the District
17 ~~Attorney's~~ Attorneys Council;

18 12. One member shall be a representative of the Council on Law
19 Enforcement, Education and Training;

20 13. One member shall be a representative of the Department of
21 Corrections;

22 14. One member shall be a representative of Court Appointed
23 Special Advocates;

1 15. One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma Bar
2 Association;

3 16. One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma
4 Psychological Association;

5 17. One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma
6 Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers;

7 18. One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma
8 Association of Youth Services;

9 19. One member shall be a representative of the Indian Child
10 Welfare Association;

11 20. One member shall be a representative of the Advisory Task
12 Force on Child Abuse and Neglect appointed by the Governor; ~~and~~

13 21. One member shall be a representative of ~~the~~
14 ~~Postadjudication Review Board~~ Program **a postadjudication review**
15 **board program;** and

16 22. One member shall be a representative of **a child advocacy**
17 **center.**

18 C. The appointed members shall be persons having expertise in
19 the dynamics, identification and treatment of child abuse and
20 neglect and child sexual abuse.

21 D. The Child Abuse Training and Coordination Council shall:

22 1. Establish objective criteria and guidelines for
23 multidisciplinary and, as appropriate for each discipline,

1 discipline-specific training on child abuse and neglect for
2 professionals with responsibilities affecting children, youth and
3 families;

4 2. Review curricula and make recommendations to state agencies
5 and professional organizations and associations regarding available
6 curricula and curricula having high standards of professional merit;

7 3. Review curricula regarding child abuse and neglect used in
8 law enforcement officer training by the Oklahoma Council on Law
9 Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) and make recommendations
10 regarding the curricula to CLEET;

11 4. Cooperate with and assist professional organizations and
12 associations in the development and implementation of ongoing
13 training programs and strategies to encourage professionals to
14 participate in such training programs;

15 5. Make reports and recommendations regarding the continued
16 development and improvement of such training programs to the State
17 Commissioner of Health, the Oklahoma Commission on Children and
18 Youth, and each affected agency, organization and association;

19 6. Prepare and issue a model protocol for multidisciplinary
20 teams regarding the investigation and prosecution of child sexual
21 abuse, child physical abuse and neglect cases;

22 7. Review and approve protocols prepared by the local
23 multidisciplinary teams;

- 1 8. Advise multidisciplinary teams on team development;
- 2 9. Collect data on the operation and cases reviewed by the
- 3 multidisciplinary teams;
- 4 10. Issue annual reports; and
- 5 11. Annually approve the list of functioning multidisciplinary
- 6 teams in the state.

7 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation

8 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby

9 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and

10 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
