

An Act relating to state government; creating the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act; providing short title; amending Section 1, Senate Joint Resolution No. 42, O.S.L. 2002 (74 O.S. Supp. 2003, Section 10.6), which relates to cabinet secretaries; creating the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security; terminating the Office of Interim Oklahoma Homeland Security Director; providing for the appointment of an Oklahoma Homeland Security Director; providing for compensation and retirement; stating qualifications; providing for commissioning of Director as peace officer; authorizing certain personnel; stating duties and responsibilities of the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security; providing for the establishment of certain strategic objectives; requiring the establishment of a statewide emergency response system with certain provisions and procedures; authorizing certain contracts; directing the cooperation between certain state agencies and persons; creating the Oklahoma Homeland Security Revolving Fund; designating that fund be continuing; providing for the receipt of monies from certain sources; providing for the appropriation of monies received; stating authorized expenditures; creating advisory councils for the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security; providing for membership; stating duties of the councils; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 500.18, as last amended by Section 86, Chapter 3, O.S.L. 2003 (74 O.S. Supp. 2003, Section 500.18), which relates to the State Travel Reimbursement Act; authorizing the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security to pay certain expenses; amending 75 O.S. 2001, Section 250.4, as last amended by Section 13, Chapter 279, O.S.L. 2003 (75 O.S. Supp. 2003, Section 250.4), which relates to the Administrative Procedures Act; exempting the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security from certain requirements of the act; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 840-5.5, as last amended by Section 98 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2725 of the 2nd Session of the 49th Oklahoma Legislature, which relates to classification of positions; unclassifying certain positions in the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security; providing for codification; providing for recodification; and declaring an emergency.
