HOUSE BILL HB2103:

McCarter

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to motor vehicles; establishing certain penalties for failing to yield the right-of-way; requiring proceeds from certain fines be used to fund the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-407 of Title 47, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a person who is convicted of failing to yield the right-of-way to another vehicle under Sections 11-401 through 11-404 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, is subject to:

1. If the violation contributes to an accident resulting in bodily injury to another person:

- a. a fine of \$500.00, and
- b. suspension of the driver license of the person for ninety (90) days; or

2. If the violation contributes to an accident resulting in the death of another person:

- a. a fine of \$1,000.00, and
- b. suspension of the driver license of the person for six (6) months.

B. All fines imposed under subsection A of this section concerning a violation in which the vehicle is a motorcycle, shall

be used to fund the Motorcycle Safety and Education Program
established in Section 40-121 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2004.
