**Second Regular Session of the Forty-ninth Legislature**

**of the State of Oklahoma**

**Twenty-fourth Legislative Day, Thursday, March 11, 2004**

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Hilliard.

The roll was called with 100 Members present.

The following Member was excused: Stanley.—1.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Reverend Terry Martindale, First Methodist Church of Guthrie, Guthrie.

The Journal for the last legislative day was approved.

## **REMARKS**

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Davis, the remarks of Reverend Martindale were ordered printed in full as follows:

“Please join me in prayer. Our most gracious and loving God, another glorious day, the rain, the sun, you have given it all. We give thanks for the opportunities of this day and we ask that you help us to have open hearts and open minds that we may receive and meet the challenges. I pray your blessings upon this body this day. It’s been a long week, a short night. A lot of work. A lot of work on behalf of your people. We give thanks for the dedication of each one of these members and all the staff that works with the House, we give thanks for the unselfish giving that they have for your people and that your people would have the quality of life that you would desire for all people. We ask your blessing upon each one this day that they would feel a renewed sense of strength, a renewed sense of energy, and renewed sense of purpose to which you call us all, to be light to the world wherever we be. We pray all these things in your Holy Name. Amen.

Mr. Speaker, Members, it's been a pleasure to be here this week and to experience all that goes on here. For those of us who haven't been able to experience this, it comes as a shock. There is lots going on here and I thank my sponsor, Representative Frank Davis, for inviting me and allowing me to be here. As our friend Garrison Keillor might say about this week, "It's been a long, hard week in Lake Wobegone." I know that you are feeling it. You have been through it and it looks like you have come through it relatively unscathed. There may be few minor scrapes and maybe a few bruises. But I can tell you this, that as many of us complain about what goes on in government, from time to time many of us do truly appreciate the work that you do and what you are about for the good of the people of Oklahoma. We do, indeed, appreciate you.

Have you ever heard of someone with more than two hands? When you hear them talking about a particular issue, they will say, "Well, on the one hand, and then on the other hand, and then on the other hand, many, many hands – this devotional, I don't know what the difference between a devotional and a sermon is, maybe just length. I don't know. I'll try to remember that. You may see this devotional as a two-handed devotional and I hope it won't go any further than that. I'd like to remind you first of all this morning of the words from the Gospel of John. At the very beginning of the Gospel of John, it says, "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God and all things were made by Him and without Him was not anything made that was made. In Him was life and the Life was the light of men. And the light shineth in darkness and the darkness overcame it not."

I'd like to begin this morning by asking how many of you have seen the movie? You know the one I'm talking about. I heard that some of you got in trouble for skipping out and going to the movie. If you haven't seen the movie, you undoubtedly have heard a lot of talk about it. *The Passion of the Christ*. One thing about this movie, if it doesn't evoke feeling from you, you better check your pulse, because this movie -- you can't watch it without having some kind of emotion going along with it. Being a baby-boomer generation person, I have grown up with movies that portrayed violence from the days of Sam Peckinpah and the *Wild Bunch*, to the days of Peter Jackson and *The Lord of the Rings*. I don't go see movies for violence, but it just so happens that some of the movies that I see have violence in them. But I must say that *The Passion of the Christ* is undoubtedly the most graphically gruesome movie I have ever seen. There were many times during the movie that I had to close my eyes. I just couldn't watch it any longer. For that reason I'm not giving it a blanket endorsement for all my church members to go see. There are some churches who are. Even if I could afford it, I wouldn't buy a theater out for my church to go see it. It bothered me to see younger children attending the movie. I don't believe it's a movie for every person to go see. I was talking to an older woman in my congregation this week and she said "I don't think I'm going to that movie and I feel guilty because I'm not." And I said, "Well, when was the last time you went to a movie?" And she said, "Well, I have heard they are making talkies now." I said, "What was the last movie you saw?" She said, "The last movie I saw in a theater was *The Sound of Music*." I said, "This is probably not the movie that you need to see." Many people don't need to see this movie merely for the fact that they can appreciate what Christ did without seeing the movie.

Many emotions were evoked within me as I watched. From the very opening scene, the Garden of Gethsemane, clear to the end, one of the things that really touched me and stirred me and made me angry was the soldiers--the soldiers laughing all the way through the movie. As they scourged Christ, as they flogged Him, as they whipped Him throughout, they laughed, all the way through. Unbelievable cruelty, unbelievable cruelty.

A different time, a different situation, a different society, and yet I was reminded of a time in my life, just a few years ago. There were several of us who joined a Catholic priest and went down to McAlester to take part in a vigil that happened outside the gates of the penitentiary at McAlester, on a night that there was an execution about to be taking place. There were about twenty or thirty of us gathered there for the vigil. We were singing, we were praying and we were reading Scripture. And there were over a hundred people there to celebrate the execution. They had -- this was when the executions took place at midnight -- and they had their children there, wrapped in blankets, because it was cold. They had their lawn chairs, they had their ice chests full of beer and they were celebrating. This was a party. And when the officer came out and said, "The execution has taken place and the prisoner has been pronounced dead." the beer cans were raised in the air and they started singing, "Na, na, na, hey, hey, hey, Goodbye." It was a party.

Now wherever you stand on the death penalty, you have to be appalled that there is a portion of our society that exhibits this same unbelievable cruelty that was exhibited the last twelve hours of the life of Christ. The truth is, they beat Jesus, they whipped Jesus, they stripped Jesus, they thought that they had killed Jesus for all time, but the light shines through the darkness. The darkness could not overcome it. After three days Jesus walked away from that tomb. The darkness could not overcome the light. Not then, not now, not ever.

From that day when Jesus walked out of that tomb, there have been glimpses of light that have shown through that tell us that darkness will not overcome the light. Today in the midst of a world that is torn apart by war and violence and hatred, darkness seems to be prevailing in many places. It won't. It never will. The darkness cannot overcome the light, for as much as we see a violent, war-torn world full of hatred, we also see the light shining in many places. Where there are hungry children being fed, the light is shining. Where there are soldiers reaching out to refugees and widows and orphans, the light is shining. Where there are young people standing up and saying "I will not drink" and "I will not do drugs", the light is shining. Where there are black people standing up for white people, and white people standing up for Asian people, and Asian people standing up for Hispanic people, the light is shining. Where there are Republicans voting with Democrats and Democrats voting with Republicans, the light is shining. Where Sooners and Cowboys root for each other -- well maybe that's going too far. But I'm here to tell you that as you look around you, you will see glimpses of the light all around. But one more thing, everything we do is a decision. Everything we do is a decision, for the darkness or the light. It may take a lot of discerning as to which is which, but that discernment is part of our journey. When we do discover which is the light, our decision becomes whether it's to let the light shine or not. I invite you, I encourage you, I ask you, to do all that you can to let the light shine. Not to put any pressure on you, but you all have the most opportunity of anyone in the State to let the light shine. Now maybe that is putting a little pressure on you, but you do have the opportunity, with every decision that you make. The light is in the world and the darkness could not, can not, will not overcome it.

I thought about the possibility of asking you to raise your finger in the air and singing, "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine." I won't do that but you do have a light. I know you do. You may hide it under your papers, or in your lap. But you've got a light. I would invite you to let it shine. Don't let anyone blow it out. Let it shine. I thank you for all the good that you do. May we pray together one more time. Oh God, show us the light, your light. Let us be beacons of your light, so the darkness will not even be known. In your most Holy Name we pray, Amen. Thank you."
