

## **Fifty-second Legislative Day**

**Thursday, April 29, 2004**

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Hilliard.

The roll was called with 94 Members present.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Mike E. O'Neal, President, Oklahoma Christian University, Edmond.

### **Representative Askins Presiding**

#### **REMARKS**

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative Vaughn, the remarks of President O'Neal were ordered printed in full as follow:

“Few educated, thoughtful people would deny that the history of the United States is the story of the triumphant advancement of human freedom and human dignity. Over the years there have been many challenges to our nation and to our liberty B from its infancy it was born in travail against its own parent country, to the mid-19th century conflict of brother against brother in a bloody Civil War, to the great World Wars of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century, to the all-too-frequent assassinations of great and promising leaders, to the divisive and

tragic Vietnam conflict which I observed first-hand while our political leaders bargained away the blood and the honor of over 50,000 American sons, husbands, and fathers, to the 1995 cowardly bombing of the Murrah building here in Oklahoma City, to the current War on Terrorism, or more accurately stated, Terrorism=s war on America and American ideals. America=s history is a mixture of sad and glorious dramatic spectacles, confirming the adage that *Athe price of freedom is eternal diligence.*@

Today, however, I would like to call our thoughts to an even greater danger that is eroding the very foundation of our liberty and our way of life. History is replete with human conflict. After centuries of conflict, we have found only two ways to deal with it *B* either settle with the use of power, or subordinate *Amy way*@ to a principle that transcends self-interest. It is that kind of transcendent principle that is in jeopardy today. It is being assailed by the swelling tide of ethical, moral, and cultural relativism that denies there are any moral absolutes or transcendent principles. As stated so well by my friend Dr. Michael Armour, *AIn the absence of transcendent principles, civilized political discussion gives way to shrill shouting matches, name-calling, character-assassination, and malicious mistreatment of the other side. The conversation is no longer about principles, but about destroying the opponent and drowning out his voice.*@ Might I add that it also leads to the dumbing-down we see so prevalent in education, the lack of civility in public life, and the sound-bite mentality of our media and our general populace.

If we have forgotten our own history, can we not learn from what we observe in Russia or Afghanistan or Iraq *B* countries which have no history of transcendent truth, or at least not one based on the principles found in the holy scriptures. They have no basis on which to build a culture of freedom and human dignity.

Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn, imprisoned and exiled by the Soviet Union, said in a commencement address at Harvard University on June 8, 1978, that *AVery well-known representatives of your society ...say: >We cannot apply moral criteria to our politics.= Thus, we mix good and evil, right and wrong, and make space for the absolute triumph of absolute evil in the world...How did the West decline from its triumphal march to its present debility?... The mistake must be at the root ... born in the Renaissance and given political expression since the Age of Enlightenment .... It has made man the measure of all things on earth B imperfect man.*@

The Old Testament is full of reminders and examples of favored nations falling when truth and righteousness and justice were neglected and people followed their own desires and appetites. The prophet Amos warned God=s people centuries ago to *ALet justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream.*@ 5:24.

In the courts of this land and in many legislatures and institutions of higher education we have forgotten that the light and liberty to which our nation=s founders referred were not arbitrary, manmade ideals. They had a common source. Nearly all the early leaders *Afound these truths to be self-evident*@ because the Creator had endowed all people with *Ainalienable rights.*@ The light and the liberty were from God, not from our own human brilliance. Two years before the Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson wrote, *AThe God who gave us life, gave us liberty at the same time.*@ Not only does life and truth come from God, but also freedom finds its origin in the Creator.

There are those today who are trying to disestablish God in our nation *B* we know who they are *B* the major media, the educational elite, the faithless judges, the politicians who compromise principle for a portion of the pork barrel, and those attacking the building

block of society B the nuclear family. In essence, these are really trying to transform the house by ripping up the foundation. If they finally succeed, they will find that the house of liberty has fallen and is no more. A recent survey of over 400 college students found that 73% say their professors teach that Awhat is right and wrong depends on difference in individual values and cultural diversity.@ Only 25% said professors teach that Athere are uniform standards of right and wrong by which everyone should be judged.@ Do the guardians of education in this state know how much of what you cherish may be systematically being undermined by those who are charged with the training of the minds of our young people?

So what does all of this mean for the Oklahoma House of Representatives in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century? Does it mean let=s just enjoy the liberty bequeathed to us by the blood of saints and patriots of old? Does it mean we can assume that the foundations of liberty are so strong that they will stand inviolable for the benefit of our children and grandchildren regardless of what we do? Can we now afford to ignore our role as guardians of liberty? I hope you agree with me that the answer to these questions is a resounding NO!

I hope you agree with me that we have a sacred trust B from those who founded the nation, from our forefathers who paid for it over and over with their blood and their fortunes, and above all from almighty God B a sacred trust to strengthen and protect the foundations of revealed truth upon which liberty and freedom stand. We must be prepared to do battle. William Jennings Bryan challenged us over a century ago: AWhat have you done for liberty? If nothing, what can freedom mean to you?@

President Reagan noted in 1967 in his first inaugural address as Governor of California, that AFreedom is a fragile thing and is never more than one generation away from extinction. It is not ours by inheritance; it must be fought for and defended constantly by each generation.@ We must teach our citizens to act consistently on the basis of principle, not expediency or cultural acceptance or popularity or personal gain. We must acknowledge that our republic and the liberty it has enjoyed is under attack both from within by moral relativism, feel good philosophy, selfishness, and post-modern value neutrality, and from without B September 11 was an attack not upon what America has done, or its people, but rather upon the ideas for which we stand. We must remember the teaching of Proverbs 14:34, that it is righteousness that exalts a nation. Do we believe with John Adams that AWe have no government armed with power capable of contending with human passions unbridled by morality and religion. Our constitution was made only for a moral and a religious people. It is wholly inadequate for the government of any other.@ We must finally agree with Thomas Jefferson, who in 1802 acknowledged that it is the God who gave us life that gave us liberty. A*Can the liberties of a nation be secure when we have removed a conviction that these liberties are a gift of God?*@

I pray that this legislature will heed the words of Jehovah spoken to His servant Solomon in 2 Chronicles 7:14: *Alf my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.*@

Two hundred twenty-seven years ago, during the winter of 1777, George Washington went to his knees humbly in prayer of his rag-tag, starving Army. The Lord honored his prayers and against seemingly impossible odds, He rescued the cold and starving troops and brought victory to a new country to be called the United States of America. Will you join me in petitioning our Creator with the words of this father of our nation?

*Almighty and eternal Lord God, the great Creator of heaven and earth, and the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ; look down from heaven in pity and compassion upon me Thy servant, who humbly prostrates myself before Thee. Bless O Lord the whole race of mankind, and let the world be filled with the Knowledge of Thee and Thy Son, Jesus. Of all the dispositions and habits which lead to political prosperity, religion and morality are indispensable supports. In vain would that man claim the tribute of patriotism, who should labor to subvert these great pillars of human happiness, these firmest props of the duties of men and citizens. To the distinguished character of a Patriot, it should be our highest glory to add the more distinguished character of a Christian...[Lord] dispose us all, to do justice, to love mercy, and to demean ourselves with that charity, humility, and pacific temper of mind, which were the characteristics of the Divine Author of our blessed religion, and without an humble imitation of whose example in these things, we can ever hope to be a happy Nation. @ Valley Forge, 1777.*
