AMENDMENT NO. 1: Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause  
and entire bill and insert

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 41.5v of Title 62, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Office of State Finance shall create a standard security  
risk assessment for state agency information technology systems that  
complies with the International Organization for Standardization  
(ISO) and the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC)  
Information Technology - Code of Practice for Security Management  
(ISO/IEC 17799). The final assessment report shall identify,

prioritize, and document information security vulnerabilities for each of the state agencies assessed.

B. Each state agency that has an information technology system shall conduct an information security risk assessment to identify vulnerabilities associated with the information system on an annual basis. The information security risk assessment shall be completed by the first day of December of each year. Failure to comply may result in funding being withheld from the agency. The state agencies shall use either the standard security risk assessment created by the Office of State Finance or a third-party risk assessment meeting the ISO/IEC 17799 and approved by the Office of State Finance. The Office of State Finance shall select at least two firms for agencies to conduct the information security risk assessment.

C. The Office of State Finance shall report the results of the assessments required under this section to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate by the first day of January of each year.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2006.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
