BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4240 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Any person under eighteen (18) years of age operating an all-terrain vehicle shall wear a helmet.

B. Any person under fourteen (14) years of age operating an all-terrain vehicle shall not carry a passenger unless the vehicle is designed by the manufacturer to transport a passenger.

C. A person who violates a provision of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

D. As used in this act all-terrain vehicle means a motorized vehicle manufactured and used exclusively for off-highway use which is sixty (60) inches or less in width, with an unladen dry weight of one thousand five hundred (1,500) pounds or less, traveling on two or more low-pressure tires.

E. The provisions of this section shall not apply to all-terrain vehicles while being used for agricultural purposes.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
