An Act relating to cities and towns; amending Section 4, Chapter 62, O.S.L. 2004 (11 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 51-203), which relates to the Oklahoma Municipal Employee Collective Bargaining Act; and adding certain employees to be excluded from act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 62, O.S.L. 2004 (11 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 51-203), is amended to read as follows:

Section 51-203. The following public employees shall be excluded from the provisions of ~~this act~~ the Oklahoma Municipal Employee Collective Bargaining Act:

1. Elected officials and persons appointed to fill vacancies in elected offices, and members of any board or commission;
2. Representatives of a municipal employer, including the administrative officer, director, or chief executive officer of a municipal employer, or major division thereof, as well as his or her deputy, first assistant, and any non-bargaining unit supervisory employees; provided, however, that nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit a municipal employer from bargaining with, and entering into a contract with, a labor organization certified to represent a separate unit comprised solely of supervisors;
3. Confidential employees;
4. Temporary employees employed for a period of four (4) months or less in any twelve-month period;
5. Patients and inmates employed, sentenced or committed to any state or local institution;

6. Employees of public trust hospitals;

7. Firefighters and police officers as defined in Section 51-102 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title;

~~7.~~ 8. Employees of school districts as defined in Section 509.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

~~8.~~ 9. Employees of institutions of ~~the~~ The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education as defined in Section 3201 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

~~9.~~ 10. Employees of county governments; and

~~10.~~ 11. Employees of the State of Oklahoma, as defined in Section 840-1.3 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
