BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006, the  
Department of Public Safety shall budget all funds in the following  
categories and amounts:

SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
upon the Department of Public Safety by law shall be set by the  
Director. The Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year

ending June 30, 2006, shall be subject to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures, except the full-time-equivalent employee limit shall not include cadets while they are members of a patrol school or during their employment in probationary status, excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

SECTION 3. Of the monies appropriated to the Department of Public Safety in this act, \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) shall be expended for the services of a Capitol Patrol Officer to the Oklahoma Workers' Compensation Court pursuant to a contract between the Department of Public Safety and the Oklahoma Workers' Compensation Court.

SECTION 4. Of the monies appropriated to the Department of Public Safety not more than \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) shall be used for the annual lease payment of the Clinton/Sherman Industrial Complex.

SECTION 5. The Department of Public Safety is hereby authorized to expend \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) from the Department of Public Safety Patrol Vehicle Revolving Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, for the purchase of patrol vehicles and equipping those vehicles.

SECTION 6. Of the monies available to the Department of Public Safety, not more than \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$0.00) may be used to support the Board of Tests for Alcohol and Drug Influence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006.

SECTION 7. Appropriations made by this act, not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for

the fiscal year ending June 30, 2006 (hereafter FY-06) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007 (hereafter FY-07). Funds budgeted for FY-06 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2006, and must be expended by November 15, 2006. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2006, and not budgeted for FY-07, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-07 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2007. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2007, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-06, and not required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-07, after the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds from the FY-06 budget work program and after such revision has been approved by the Office of State Finance.

SECTION 8. This act shall become effective July 1, 2005.

SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
