WHEREAS, the Iraqi people, and the Iraqi electoral officials through the Iraqi elections, provided an incentive to strive for

freedom for those who reside in a country formerly governed by tyranny and oppression; and

WHEREAS, the Iraqi election, as a result of the Iraqi people's dedication and determination to vote in defiance of those who would oppress or kill them, has contributed to the democratic principles in the Middle East; and
