WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation (OMRF) is
celebrating its 60th anniversary in 2006; and

WHEREAS, for six decades this private, not-for-profit biomedical
facility has specialized in critical research in areas such as
immunology, cardiovascular biology, and brain diseases in search of
new treatment methods and cures for diseases like cancer, lupus,
heart disease, and Alzheimer's; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation is home to Oklahoma's only member of the National Academy of Sciences and was awarded, in 2005, twenty-seven million dollars in research grants and contracts by the National Institutes of Health; and

WHEREAS, OMRF has an annual impact of \$46 million on the State of Oklahoma's economy and creates 1,000 jobs in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, over the past decade, the research at OMRF has generated eleven new start up companies and more than 100 U.S. patents; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation is dedicated to understanding and curing human diseases and has established a reputation of excellence not only in Oklahoma but throughout the national and international scientific community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
