An Act relating to definitions and provisions;  
designating the Mexican free-tailed bat as the state  
flying mammal; providing for codification; and  
providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 98.11 of Title 25, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Mexican free-tailed bat, *Tadarida brasiliensis*, is hereby  
designated and adopted as the official state flying mammal of the  
State of Oklahoma.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2006.
